

Kendall County Health Department (KCHD) Volunteer Responders:

Local Health Departments have the responsibility to develop emergency response plans; yet, they cannot do it alone. During recent disasters, the most valuable asset has been community volunteers. KCHD Volunteer Responders provide health care professionals and others an organized mechanism through which they can volunteer their time and skills. This strengthens our communities by preparing for and responding to such events as influenza outbreaks, food contaminations, or even bioterrorism attacks.

Volunteer Responders Purpose: To meet the public health needs during critical events and to support the mission of KCHD to prevent disease and protect community health. Participation allows volunteers to make a difference in their own communities by supporting response teams during community crises.

Volunteer Responders Mission: To provide a safe and secure county and region during an emergency. Kendall County Volunteer Responders will assist healthcare and emergency response professionals in reasonable capacities during public health emergencies.

WHY VOLUNTEER RESPONDERS?

- ✓ Provide a readied volunteer force to assist during health emergencies
- ✓ Permit emergency response plans to be implemented more quickly by using volunteers trained in advance
- ✓ Contribute to your community

HOW CAN VOLUNTEER RESPONDERS HELP?

- ✓ Support KCHD public health initiatives and mission
- ✓ Participate in public health emergency exercises and community disaster drills
- ✓ Assist KCHD in mass dispensing of medications and/or immunizations or evacuation when health emergencies occur

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS:

- ✓ Age 18 or older
- ✓ Have a working telephone
- ✓ Able to respond when called
- ✓ Pass Criminal background check

WHAT WILL VOLUNTEER RESPONDERS DO?

- ✓ Medical professionals are needed to evaluate and dispense needed medications to first responders and the public
- ✓ Non-medical volunteers are needed to manage administrative duties, provide direction to the public, ensure safety, and support medical activities
